# Phil's Ramblings



Hello, all....

Happy Holidays to everyone! Please enjoy them safely!

(I recently sent out an article that explains how important duration of contact with a person infected with COVID can be, especially in an indoor setting. In a worst-case scenario – small room, no outside ventilation, with a mask – it can take as little as three minutes for someone to breathe in enough infectious droplets suspended in the air to become infected. At a family and/or friends gathering to celebrate the holidays – typically involving hours of eating, drinking and socializing indoors – the potential for one participant unaware that he or she has COVID to infect many of the attendees must be considered.)

Moving from the specific to the general, there is both good news and bad news for the U.S., regarding COVID. Several different vaccines are well along the approval cycle and could presumably be available for broad distribution during the first half of 2021. We don't yet know how effective they will be for everyone, although in controlled test environments the various manufacturers are claiming a high success rate. Further, we don't yet know how long the immunity from these shots will last. But things are definitely looking up on the vaccine front!

On the other hand, the head of the CDC, Dr. Robert Redfield, just publicly acknowledged that U.S. deaths from COVID, now at 270,000, could reach 450,000 by the end of February. That seems almost unbelievable to me, but if you do the math it does compute. The end of February is 86 days from now; for his projection to come true, we would have to see an average of 2,093 deaths per day across the U.S. Yesterday (December 3<sup>rd</sup>) the U.S. had 2,857 COVID deaths; that's 36% higher than the daily rate in Redfield's projection! Hospitals are filling up and most experts expect to see a spike in new cases from Thanksgiving travel and socialization and from the major holidays in December and

January. Not pretty!

Looking ahead, I expect that we will be meeting virtually at least through the first quarter of 2021, and perhaps longer. During this same time period, it is unlikely to be safe for us to meet in person for any length of time with friends and family members who do not already live in our households, as well. If you have not already acquired a microphone and webcam or have not yet become comfortable with video calling over your smartphone, tablet or computer, I encourage you to do so. Lots of good webcams (most with built-in microphones) are now available at Amazon.com, at very reasonable prices. (My daughter just bought one for her work-related Zoom calls for under \$30, as an improvement over the video quality of her laptop webcam.) J.J. has been sending out a steady stream of links and announcements related to video-calling tutorials and presentations. Please take advantage of them so that we can see your smiling faces at our future Zoom meetings, and so that you can use the magic of technology to stay in touch with other friends and family!

On the technology front, tech products in general seem to be more available than earlier in the year. It appears the pipeline is filling once more after the unusual demand for computers, webcams and other tech needed to support online learning for students across the country and working from home for many employees whose businesses have closed their offices or who are unable to travel to meet with customers or suppliers. I've already mentioned webcams, but computer and smartphone availability seems better to me as well, and we have been seeing some good prices during recent Black Friday and Cyber Monday sales.

In closing, I want to share a story that illustrates the need for digital afterlife planning, a topic that we discussed in detail several years ago. A single man I knew who lived alone died suddenly two weeks ago. As part of his duties, the executor of his will located his laptop and smartphone – intending to access them for information about his financial affairs. Both

devices are password protected and the executor has been unable to find the passwords. There are apparently steps that can be taken to gain access to one or both devices, but life would have been much simpler had the executor been given that information long ago – or at least told where to look. Please take time to step back and review your own situation – as I will be doing – to avoid this type of issue for your family members and/or executor.

Hope to see you all at our December online Holiday Party at 1:00 pm on Saturday, December 12<sup>th</sup>! (And remember that our January LCACE meeting will be devoted to “show ‘n tell” about tech goodies that you received (or bought for yourself) during the holidays.....)

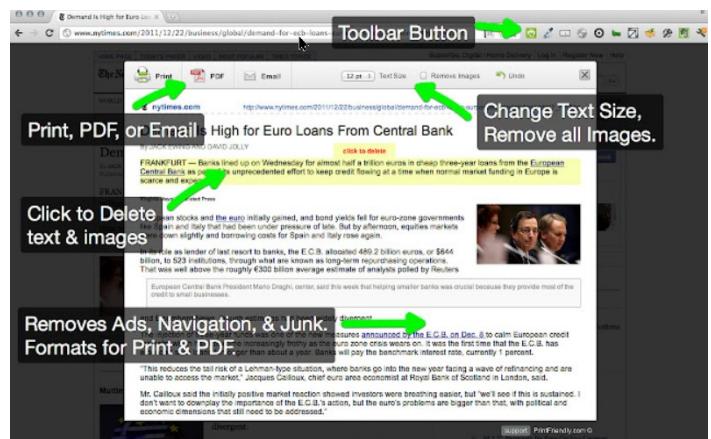
## PrintFriendly

While attending a weekly episode of “Tech for Seniors”, I was introduced to PrintFriendly This FREE app cleans and formats web pages for perfect print experience.

PrintFriendly removes ads, and web page junk, so you save paper and ink with you print. It is free and easy to use. PrintFriendly installs as an extension in you web browser, so with just a click your web page is converted.



Once the page is stripped of all the junk, I can edit the page with just a Click-to-delete any content I do not want to remain on the page. I have the choice to keep or retain any images, and I am now able to change the text size.

The file can be generated as a PDF for archiving, sharing, or saving, PDFs file will include the clickable links and source URLs so you can continue to interact.

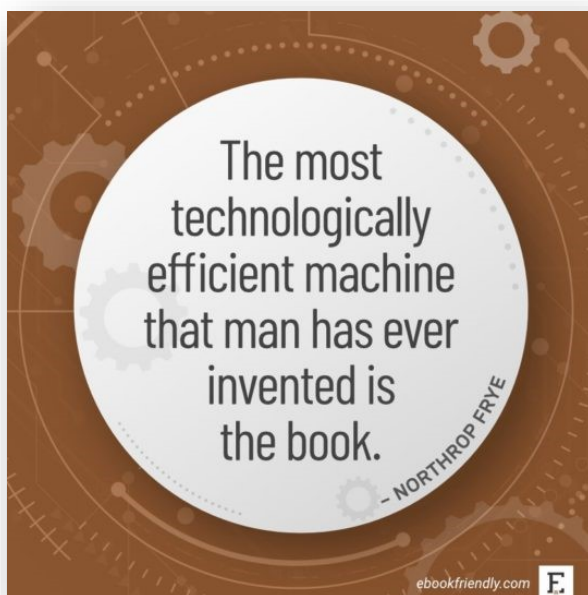

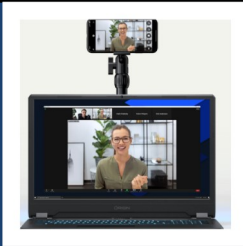

# EPOCAM

Turn your iPhone into a webcam in minutes

Zooming with other computer clubs is so informative. This past week, I have learned about a new app that allows me to turn my iPhone into a webcam. I presently have two webcams attached to my desktop, but I have recently created a few presentations where I needed a third camera. Now with the use of EPOCAM, I can use my iPhone as an overhead or over the shoulder webcam to enhance my productivity. EPOCAM is a FREE download, for Windows PC or a Mac to use the iPhone as a webcam. To use all the

features, you can upgrade to the Pro version for \$7.99. You can use EPOCAM over WiFi or using a USB connection. After downloading and installing the driver for your computer you are good to go. You can stream from your front or back camera and take advantage of the phone flashlight if so needed. EPOCAM can be used with Zoom or Skype as your webcam. The free version is only 640x480 pixels which is a reason to pay the \$7.99 for the EPOCAM HD version and get the full 1080 support. EPOCAM is also available on Android,

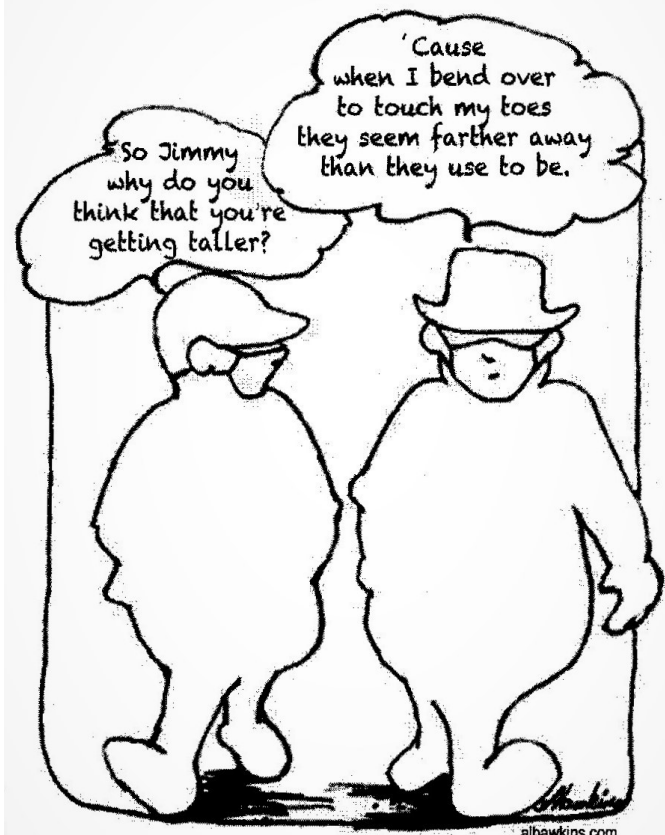

**Answer:** The first "computer bug" was, in fact, a literal bug. Computer scientist and U.S. Navy Rear Admiral Grace Hopper, coined the term bug in 1947 after operators traced an error in Harvard University's Mark II computer to a moth trapped in a relay. The moth was carefully removed and taped to the machines' log book. Grace Hopper added the caption "First actual case of bug being found". This was the first time anyone used the word "bug" to describe a computer glitch. The engineers who found the moth were the first to literally "debug" a machine.
